All Liturgical Ministers, Active, Inactive, and Substitutes

Over the two years of the pandemic, our Liturgical Ministries have been challenged by all the changes we have had to make to adapt to the situations as they evolved and developed. We thank you for your flexibility and your continued service. Father Larry and the Liturgy Committee believe it is time to renew and refresh our commitment to serve. Many family situations have changed, parishioners have moved, and new parishioners have joined the parish. All of these are signs of new and vigorous life in the parish. However we have also seen a significant number of ministers in some ministries who have not returned to active service.

Each weekend, in order to have the four liturgies we offer, we need about 75 stewards serving our faith community. It is a momentous undertaking each weekend. And the commitment for which we ask speaks directly to our role as stewards of the talents given to us, in order to be shared for the benefit of others. As such, we ask for your renewed commitment to serve as a Liturgical Minister. The Liturgical Ministry Leaders are scheduling four sessions to allow the maximum flexibility for ministers and those interested in becoming liturgical ministers to attend one of the sessions. We are asking that ALL current ministers (Active, Inactive, and Substitute) attend one of these sessions. If you are unable to attend one of the sessions, you will be contacted about your commitment to continue to serve in your ministry. The sessions will be about 1 hour and will have a brief period of catechesis, refresher discussion of the role of each ministry in the Mass, an opportunity for Q&A, and a time for breakout for each ministry Leader to meet with their ministry.
