Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Fridays during Lent, beginning at 6:00 PM. The Holy Trinity community is encouraged to come and participate.

What Do We Get From Praying the Stations of the Cross? The Stations of the Cross continue to be a vital Catholic devotion 1,681 years later and counting, and according to Pope Francis, there are many reasons why praying the Stations of the Cross matters.

They involve in the นร story. "How many people were with Jesus on the way to Calvary: Pilate, Simon of Cyrene, Mary, the women? Sometimes we can be like Pilate, who did not have the courage to go against the tide to save Jesus' life. and instead washed his hands...The Cross of Christ teaches us to be like Simon of Cyrene, who helped Jesus to carry that heavy wood; it teaches us to be like Mary and the other women, who were not afraid to accompany Jesus. Who are you like? Like Pilate? Like Simon? Like Mary?"

They allow us to place our trust in Him. "The Cross of Christ contains all the love of God, His immeasurable mercy. This is a love in which we can place all our trust, in which we can believe...let us bring to Christ's Cross our joys, our sufferings and our failures. There we will find a Heart that is open to us and understands us, forgives us, loves us, and calls us to bear this love in our lives, to love each person, each brother and sister, with the same love."

They remind us God triumphs over all evil. "With Him, evil, suffering, and death do not have the last word, because He gives us hope and life: He has transformed the Cross from an instrument of hate, defeat, and death into a sign of love, victory, and life."

They show us how much God loves us. "It (the Cross) gives us a treasure that no one else can give: the certainty of the unshakable love which God has for us. A love so great that it enters into our sin and forgives it, enters into our suffering and gives us the strength to bear it." St. Paul put it best in his letter to the Romans, "you might sacrifice your life for someone who was good or just. Yet, Christ sacrificed His life while we were sinners for our salvation."

Good News Holy Trinity!

Holy Trinity parish now has an active St, Vincent de Paul Conference (SVDP)! We have completed our "start-up" first 6 months of serving the needy in our midst by offering them a HAND UP, not just a HANDOUT, as they strive to live a more stable life in our community.

Here at Holy Trinity, our activities to help may look a little different from what we often see SVDP Conferences do at other parishes. Because we don't have the space to provide a clothes closet or food pantry, all of our energies go directly to meeting in person with our neighbors who are in need. We can provide that assistance only through the ongoing generosity of all of us here at Holy Trinity, who have so much to be grateful for.

In November, the Mountain Democrat visited us and wrote an article to help us get the word out that we are here and ready to help where we can. From our "door opening" July 1 through January, we have been able to assist 45 neighbors in need (28 adults & 17 children) with payments totaling \$10,988, most of which was for rent and utilities payments. We have even been blessed to be able to assist several of our own Holy Trinity parishioners.

As our existence becomes more widely known in El Dorado County, the requests for assistance are increasing as are the opportunities to be a part of this wonderful effort. SHORTER STATIONS OF THE CROSS

We adore you O Christ and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

The First Station - Jesus is condemned to death

Consider how Jesus, after having been scourged and crowned with thorns, was unjustly condemned by Pilot to die on the cross.

The Second Station – Jesus carries his heavy cross.

Consider how Jesus, in making this journey with the cross on his shoulders, thought of us and offered for us to His father the death He was about to undergo.

The Third Station - Jesus falls the first time.

Consider the first fall of Jesus under His cross. His flesh was torn by the scourges; His head was crowned with thorns. He had lost a great quantity of blood; so weakened He could scarcely walk. He yet had to carry this great load upon His shoulders. The soldiers struck him rudely and he fell several times.

The Fourth Station – Jesus meets His sorrowful mother.

Consider this meeting of the son and the mother which took place on this journey. Their looks became like so many arrows to wound those hearts which loved each other so tenderly.

The Fifth Station – Simon helps Jesus to carry the cross.

Consider how His cruel tormentors, seeing that Jesus was on the point of expiring, and fearing He would die on the way whereas they wished Him to die the shameful death of the cross, constrained Simon of Cyrene to carry the cross behind the Lord.

The Sixth Station – Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.

Consider how the holy woman named Veronica, seeing Jesus so ill used, and bathed in sweat and blood, wiped His face with a towel on which was left the impression of His Holy face.

The Seventh Station – Jesus Falls the second time.

Consider the second fall of Jesus under the cross. A fall which renews the pain of all the wounds in His body.

The Eighth Station – The women of Jerusalem weep over Jesus.

Consider how these women wept with compassion of seeing Jesus in such a pitiable state streaming His blood as he walked along. Daughters of Jerusalem, said He, weep not for me but for yourselves and for your children.

The Ninth Station - Jesus falls the third time.

Consider the third fall of Jesus Christ. His weakness was extreme and the cruelty of His executioners was excessive who tried to hasten His steps when He could scarcely move.

The Tenth Station – Jesus is stripped of his garments.

Consider the violence with which Jesus was stripped by His executioners. His inner garments adhered to His torn flesh and they dragged them off so roughly that the skin came with them. Take pity on your savior thus cruelly treated.

The Eleventh Station - Jesus is nailed to the cross.

Consider how Jesus, having been placed upon the cross, extended His hands and offered to His eternal Father the sacrifice of His life for our salvation. Those barbarians fastened Him with nails and then securing the cross allowed Him to die with anguish on this infamous gibbet.

The Twelfth Station – Jesus is raised up on the cross and dies.

Consider how Jesus being consumed with anguish after three hours of agony on the cross abandoned himself to the weight of his body, bowed His head and died. (All kneel or genuflect)

The Thirteenth Station – Jesus is taken down from the cross.

Consider how, after our Lord expired, two of His disciples, Joseph and Nicodemus, took Him down from the cross and placed Him in the arms of his afflicted mother who received Him with unutterable tenderness and pressed Him to her heart.

The Fourteen Station – Jesus is laid in the tomb.

Consider how the disciples, accompanied by His holy mother, carried the body of Jesus to bury it. They closed the tomb and all came sorrowfully away.

Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, Have mercy on us.

Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us now and at the hour of our death, Amen. Dear Jesus, by the merits of your passion and cross, we present to you all our petitions.




