Security Improvements Update

This past week more pedestrian fencing was installed at the Education Center and trenching continues for electrical to operate the vehicle gates. Vehicle gates and pedestrian gates are being made and will also be installed soon. The driveways have been cut and conduit has been installed. We will soon have low voltage, high voltage and water at each gate, location of future monument sign, and at the island of our main entrance.

St. Vincent de Paul Update

As we announced in February, the St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) Conference at Holy Trinity is now "open for business" and assisting our neighbors is need, including members of our own Holy Trinity family.

During the first quarter of 2024, our volunteer Vincentians donated 134 hours, made 21 Home Visits, and assisted 41 neighbors in need. The SVDP practice of meeting personally with our neighbors who are seeking assistance, in their place of comfort, often results in our ability to explore their situation in more depth, and perhaps offer additional types of assistance that will hopefully help them cope more successfully with the often-bumpy road of life so they can avoid the humiliation of having to ask for assistance again in the future. We have given \$6,884 in assistance during this quarter.

As you can see, the level of need in 2024 is much greater than it was in earlier, in pre-covid times. We are only able to provide this assistance of sharing our Time and Talent by virtue of your generosity in sharing your Treasure with this wonderful mission. Holy Trinity Community Servants Workday

We assist senior citizens, single parents and those who are disabled.

We begin at 8:00 AM with prayer and a blessing. Work teams are formed for each requested project and sent to the homes to begin work. We finish about 12:30 and meet for lunch before heading home. 

Questions for Faith Sharing Apr. 28 Fifth Sunday of Easter

In next Sunday's Gospel, John 15:1-8, the reading revolves around three figures: God as the vine grower, Jesus as the vine, and Jesus' followers as the branches. We are invited to "bear fruit" and "remain" which is translated as "dwell" when Jesus presents God's house as having many places for people to dwell. "Remain", then, refers to a relationship in which one feels at home, and it signifies the intimate and mutual love that exists between the Father and Jesus.



April - Child Abuse Prevention

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. It is most appropriate that Child Abuse Prevention Month is held during the Easter season. There is no better time than Easter to celebrate the protection of our most valuable gift from God - our children.

Week 4 - Did you know.....The Catholic Church is deeply committed to protecting children from abuse and holding people accountable for inflicting such pain. In December 2021, the revised Book VI of the Code of Canon Law went into effect. This is the most recent of several documents that specifically address the issue of the abuse of children. Other documents include Vos estis lux mundi and Vademecum. These documents expand the acts which are considered abusive, clarify the manner in which the cases are processed, and hold people accountable for their action or inaction with regard to processing of a case. Of significant importance is attention given to the care of victim survivors and all who have been harmed.

2024 Stewardship Renewal

Christian Stewardship is summarized in the Gospel of Mark 12:30-31:

"And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." When we love with our hearts, we are giving in hospitality. When we love with our soul, we give in prayer. When we love with our minds, we are formed in learning and knowledge by God. When we love with our strength, we give service. And when we love our neighbor, we engage in evangelization. As Christian Stewards, we acknowledge that God is the creator and owner of everything (Psalm 24:1) and He has given us the responsibility to manage His creation. We invite you to reflect on your journey as a Christian Steward during Stewardship Renewal over the next few weeks and see how God is calling you to have your life be a living sacrifice worthy of praise.
