
Respect Life Ministry Thanks You

Every young Catholic boy or girl deserves this opportunity to serve our Lord, His Holy Church, and the People of God as an Altar Server. Altar Server preparation consists of two or three "on the job" training sessions of 60 minutes each, plus about an hour of study of the Alter Server Guidebook. 
2024 Parish Mission & Healing Service Nhy Be (alholic? (And How)
