Holy Trinity School Ministry



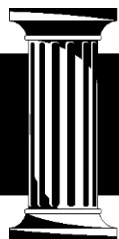
Our Holy Trinity school ministry has a girls volleyball team this year. The girls play against other Catholic schools in the area. We are so proud of their accomplishments this year.

October Is Respect Life Month

Every October in the United States, the Church celebrates Respect Life Month and asks us to reflect more deeply on the inherent dignity of each human being.

From beginning to end, or "womb to tomb," the Catechism states: "Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains forever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end." (2258). Practices such as abortion, assisted suicide and capital punishment violate the dignity of the human person and must be rejected. In today's world, this truth can be subverted in favor of how useful someone is or will be, casting aside those most vulnerable: the unborn, women and children, those living in poverty, the ill, the incarcerated, those living with disabilities and the elderly.

Walk in Christ's love with others. It's easy to say we're pro-life, but we must always remember that Jesus always put God's love into action, and we must also. "This is the way we may know that we are in union with [Jesus]: whoever claims to abide in him ought to live [just] as he lived." (1 Jn 2:6) Unexpected pregnancies, life-threatening illnesses, depression, poverty and incarceration happen constantly – what will we do if it arrives on our doorstep as a loved one or acquaintance in need? Let us resolve to act as Christ did by offering a compassionate witness, sharing life-affirming options, and walk with the most vulnerable to care for and protect human life.

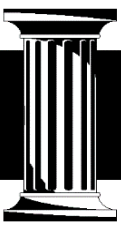

Questions for Faith Sharing Oct. 27 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

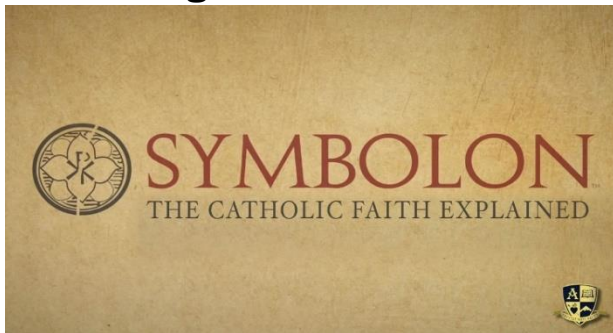
In next Sunday's Gospel, Mark 10:46-52, Jesus and his disciples are leaving Jericho on their journey to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. As they depart amid a crowd, they encounter Bartimaeus, blind and begging, on the roadside. Intuiting who Jesus is and his mission, Bartimaeus resists those who would silence him and cries out to Jesus to intercede with God on his behalf.

Although the ensuing miracle involves the regaining of physical sight, Bartimaeus already has all the sight that he needs to know who Jesus is and how God is calling him to live. The miracle is for those who crowd around, blind to God's call in their lives. Bartimaeus' faith will astound and convince them.

Who in the Church Should Participate in Political Life?

In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation. “People in every nation enhance the 8 social dimensions of their lives by acting as committed and responsible citizens” (Evangelii Gaudium, no. 220). The obligation to participate in political life is rooted in our baptismal commitment to follow Jesus Christ and to bear Christian witness in all we do.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, “It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person. . . . As far as possible citizens should take an active part in public life” (nos. 1913-1915).

10th National Eucharistic Congress

Holy Trinity Parish – Final Night

A 3-Night Return to the Spirit in Indianapolis to Grow in Love with the Eucharistic Jesus Christ
Sunday, October 20, 2024. 5:00 – 6:30 PM

Night 3: “THIS IS MY BODY”

Monsignor James P. Shea offered this speech during the National Eucharistic Congress on July 18, 2024. Using the example of our human condition of hunger Monsignor Shea speaks without any notes for 42 minutes and gives us the story of Salvation from beginning to end. You will walk away amazed at how this story compels you to look at the Eucharist with different eyes and draws you into a desire for a closeness with Jesus out of His deep and everlasting love for us. He was inaugurated in 2009 as the sixth president of the University of Mary. Msgr. Shea grew up on a dairy farm near Hazelton, ND. He earned a bachelor's degree and a licentiate in philosophy as a Basselin Fellow in the School of Philosophy at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, later studying theology at the Gregorian and Lateran universities in Rome. Upon completion of his seminary formation at the Pontifical North American College in Rome, Msgr. Shea was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Bismarck in 2002.

Each night begins in song, prayer and Scripture, includes testimonials from our own Eucharistic Pilgrims, a key-note speaker from the Congress and ends with Eucharistic Adoration, Vespers, and Benediction. Drink and dessert following.
