The evening will include the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and the Shorter Stations of the Cross followed by a free meatless soup supper in the view room. Please join us.

Jesus asked St Faustina to say the Stations of the Cross every day at 3 o'clock if her duties permitted it (Diary 1572). This practice pairs well with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and we have made available prayer cards in the back of church for this purpose.

Bring in Your Old Palms

Please bring last year's palms from Palm Sunday so we may make the ash for this year's Ash Wednesday Mass celebrations. Please place your palms in the baskets in the Church Narthex. The last day to bring in your palms will be Monday, February 12, 2024.

Ash Wednesday - February 14

Ash Wednesday is February 14, 2024, and is a day of Fasting and Abstinence from meat. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season in which the faithful are called to reflect on the Paschal Mystery more intently. It is a time of spiritual renewal and to



examine one's relationship with God and others more carefully. It is also a time in which catechumens prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The Church calls everyone, therefore, to a spirit of penance through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Masses will be celebrated at 8:15 AM, 12:00 Noon, and 7:00 PM.

Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Fridays during Lent, beginning at 6:00 PM. The Holy Trinity community is encouraged to come and participate.

What Do We Get From Praying the Stations of the Cross? The Stations of the Cross continue to be a vital Catholic devotion 1,681 years later and counting, and according to Pope Francis, there are many reasons why praying the Stations of the Cross matters.

They involve in the us story. "How many people were with Jesus on the way to Calvary: Pilate, Simon of Cyrene, Mary, the women? Sometimes we can be like Pilate, who did not have the courage to go against the tide to save Jesus' life. and instead washed his hands...The Cross of Christ teaches us to be like Simon of Cyrene, who helped Jesus to carry that heavy wood; it teaches us to be like Mary and the other women, who were not afraid to accompany Jesus. Who are you like? Like Pilate? Like Simon? Like Mary?"

They allow us to place our trust in Him. "The Cross of Christ contains all the love of God, His immeasurable mercy. This is a love in which we can place all our trust, in which we can believe...let us bring to Christ's Cross our joys, our sufferings and our failures. There we will find a Heart that is open to us and understands us, forgives us, loves us, and calls us to bear this love in our lives, to love each person, each brother and sister, with the same love."

They remind us God triumphs over all evil. "With Him, evil, suffering, and death do not have the last word, because He gives us hope and life: He has transformed the Cross from an instrument of hate, defeat, and death into a sign of love, victory, and life."

They show us how much God loves us. "It (the Cross) gives us a treasure that no one else can give: the certainty of the unshakable love which God has for us. A love so great that it enters into our sin and forgives it, enters into our suffering and gives us the strength to bear it." St. Paul put it best in his letter to the Romans, "you might sacrifice your life for someone who was good or just. Yet, Christ sacrificed His life while we were sinners for our salvation."

Jesus led by example and the Stations of the Cross are one of the great many tools for living Jesus leaves for us. By meditating on each of the stations we increase both our sorrow for our sins against God and our need for His help in bearing our own crosses. When we meditate on the Stations of the Cross, we can learn the true meaning of love, perseverance, obedience, humility, and patience.



Diocese of Sacramento – Lenten Regulations and Observances

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season where the faithful are called to reflect on the Paschal Mystery, engage in spiritual renewal, and examine one's relationship with God. The Church calls everyone to a spirit of penance through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

In order to foster a spirit of repentance and unite ourselves more closely to Christ, Church law requires the observance of Abstinence and Fasting during Lent.

Abstinence

All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Other forms of abstinence, for example abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the Internet, and social media, are also beneficial.

Fasting

Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. Fasting is understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten, but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work are seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest should be consulted.

PRAYER

Catholics are urged to read and pray with sacred Scripture and to deepen their faith by reading the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The faithful are encouraged to participate in penance services and Eucharistic adoration.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

The faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year. Confession is offered on Saturday's from 4:30-5:15 p.m. and by appointment.

Lenten Mass Schedule

The faithful are urged to attend Mass on weekdays as often as possible. Daily Masses are prayed at 8:15 a.m. Monday through Friday; and on 1st Saturdays.

Easter Duty

All Catholics who have been initiated into the Holy Eucharist are bound to receive holy communion worthily at least once during the Easter Season. In the United States, the Easter duty may be fulfilled through the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

ALMSGIVING

All Catholics are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church, especially through their local parish and the Annual Catholic Appeal. The faithful are also encouraged to visit the sick, the homebound, the aged, and those in prison. Fasting and abstinence together with almsgiving and charitable works unite us to the crucified Christ reflected in the image of our brothers and sisters who suffer.
