Why are we using bells during Mass?

This past weekend we began the ringing of bells during Mass. This is a new practice at our parish, but the traditional use of bells in our Catholic Faith goes back to about 400 AD. In that tradition, we've been using bells since the founding of our Parish.

Our "Bell Tower" uses bells to mark the hours of the day. The tradition of exterior bells that can be heard "out in the world" signifies that a Christian church is present and is announcing an important message...the Gospel! The bells are also a "call to worship" for the faithful, both at times for Holy Mass and prayer throughout the day. They are also used as a "Funeral Toll", following a Mass for the dead.

A second type of bell we have been using for many years is called the "Sanctuary Bell". We know this bell as a "gong", which is located at the entrance to the Nave (inside of the Church) and calls us to attention for the beginning of Mass. Not only do we stand for the Entrance Hymn and the beginning of Mass, but we bring our "spiritual selves" to attention and for full and active participation in the Mass.


The third type of bell, which we just began using are known as the "Sanctus bells." The name comes from the prayer we know as, "Holy, Holy, Holy"; that is said right before the Eucharistic Prayer begins. The Latin, "Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus", means "Holy, Holy, Holy". This small group of bells is used to announce a heavenly wake-up call to all present about where they are and what they are being called into. During the Eucharistic Prayer, the Epiclesis (Greek: "invocation") of the Holy Spirit upon the offerings of bread and wine proceeds the words of institution—the words used by Jesus himself in the Upper Room at the Last Supper — "This is my body . . . This is my blood ...". At the start of the Epiclesis, the Sanctus bells are rung. After the Epiclesis and the completion of the prescribed Eucharistic Prayer, the bells are also rung at the elevations of the Sacred Body and the Precious Blood.

It is our hope that the use of bells at Mass will draw us more closely into this most sacred part of the Mass, and in doing so, bring us into a greater love of Jesus Christ and His Gift of the real and true presence of Himself in the Eucharist.


Questions for Faith Sharing Aug. 25 Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time


