In next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 21:28-32, Jesus reminds Israel's priests and elders that although they know how to draw near to God, they failed to recognize the desire of sinners to do the same. The Gospel contains many stories of the sudden and total conversion of tax collectors and prostitutes. Their desire for change was real and as they transformed their lives they gave evidence that God was at work among them. True conversion, however, must be supported by our actions, otherwise it is meaningless.

Fall Ordinary Time a time of continued reflection!

With every new season, we experience changes all around us. During Fall, a new school year begins; temperatures start to cool; days become shorter; crops are harvested; and our summer landscape transforms into vibrant hues of yellow, orange, red, and green.

At Holy Trinity, our liturgical environment also changed with new Fall banners and beautiful autumn floral arrangements. The two banners on the sides of the altar include a mix of nature's colors visible through our stunning beveled art glass windows while the choirside banner features a vine with branches, an abundance of grapes, and leaves in various shades.

As we heard in this week's Gospel (Mt 20:1-16), Matthew tells us about a parable Jesus told them. He wrote "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard." Throughout the day, the landowner hired laborers to work in the vineyard. When it was evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.'

Each laborer received the usual daily wage, regardless of when they started to work. The first laborer grumbled against the landowner saying 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' The landowner replied 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Matthew ended this Gospel by writing "Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."



This parable helps us understand that our faith is like a vineyard. It must be nourished and tended to so it will grow in abundance. It also teaches us that with God's generous mercy and compassion, all of us have the same opportunity to receive the same reward – to enter the kingdom of heaven – regardless of how long we have been disciples of Christ (or as in this parable, laborers in the vineyard).

We invite you to take a closer look at this banner and use it as a means of meditation.
