



### Holy Trinity School Ministry








## Questions for Faith Sharing Oct. 6 Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time



## St. Vincent de Paul

Our Holy Trinity Parish (HTP) St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) has just completed its first year of serving our neighbors in need – both within our Parish family and in our community. Staying true to the tenets of our now international organization, our HTP SVdP Conference is committed to the essential elements established by the founding fathers in 1833: **Spirituality, Friendship, Service** to "build a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need."

So, our SVdP is working to give a "Hand Up" not just a "Handout" to our neighbors in need as our goal is to assist them in creating a more stable path forward. Because HTP does not have the facilities for a clothes closet or food cupboard as many Conferences do, our work relies on face-to-face Home Visits made by a team of a man & woman to best examine their total situation and develop a realistic plan for moving forward.

One example of a family we assisted is that of a Mom (Amy) who was raised in the Foster Care system, married young and is now the single parent of two teenagers she is raising on her own. She supports her family by working as a meal delivery driver because it allows her the flexibility she needs to be a present single parent for her children, one of whom has Autism and requires specialized services. On New Year's Eve, as she was making a delivery, she was hit by a drunk driver and her car was seriously damaged so that she could not work.

Because she normally makes good financial decisions and had some savings, all she asked for from SVdP was \$350 to make sure she would be able to pay her rent and not end up homeless with her children, which we were pleased to be able to give her. At the end of our Home Visit, she warmed our hearts by telling us that she only hopes to someday be able to help others as we were able to help her stay afloat. When we checked in a couple of months later, she assured us that her car had been repaired and they were doing well, In our first year, we assisted 145 people (86 adults & 59 children) and our total assistance given was \$21,015.89. Our members drove more than 2,000 miles and gave nearly 600 hours of their time. All of this is possible only with the financial support of our HTP family and other generous donors. Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

### YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.

SR. BETHANY MADONNA, SV: Sister Bethany is the local superior and mission coordinator of the Phoenix chapter of the Sisters of Life. There, she walks with women in crisis pregnancy, women who have had abortions, and women who need support and guidance. At one point, Sister Bethany was herself a woman in crisis, not about pregnancy, but about her vocation. In her address to the Congress, she challenges all of us to ask God what He is calling us to do, and to answer Him with an unequivocal "YES!" Even though our calling seems challenging, like baby sea turtles trying to get to the waterline, our difficult journey to Heaven is necessary for our eternal happiness.



SR. JOSEPHINE GARRETT: We want to eat until we are full. Hunger is one of our natural desires because we require sustenance to live. It says in the Old Testament that the Israelite people, hungry in the desert, desired to return to slavery because there, they at least had enough to eat. They would rather die full slaves than as hungry pilgrims. Sr. Josephine Garrett speaks to the fact that it is natural to be hungry, but very often we deal with hunger, spiritual hunger, incorrectly. We should be hungry for the Lord and hungry for healing, but satiating those pangs begins with a hunger for repentance.



FR. MIKE SCHMITZ: If ignorance is the problem, then sharing the truth can lead us to knowledge, the solution to ignorance. But what if the problem isn't ignorance at all, but rather indifference? 60,000 people showed up to the National Eucharistic Congress to show reverence and honor to our God, present in the Holy Eucharist. Our problem is not that we don't know the truth. Our problem is that, too often, we just don't care. That was the message of Fr. Mike Schmitz, the keynote speaker for Revival Session 2: The Greatest Love Story. Several times throughout the night, he reminded us, "I'm not telling you anything you don't already know!" We don't need a Eucharistic Revival because we don't know the truth. We need the Revival because we lost our first love (Revelations 2:4).




MONSIGNOR JAMES SHEA: He was inaugurated in 2009 as the sixth president of the University of Mary. Msgr. Shea calls us to consider hunger and food as he provides the Biblical history of Salvation entirely from memory. "When I heard him speak, it was like I had just read the Bible in 35 minutes" (Dan H.). Monsignor Shea helps us draw all the connections of God's love and how He feeds us "True Food, and True Drink." This talk is a beautiful capstone to our three nights together.
