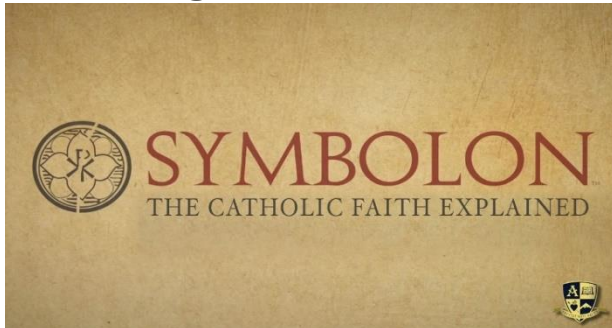
Questions for Faith Sharing Nov. 3 Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

SERVICE

Stewardship...

This is the first in a weekly series about how our Sunday readings lead us to becoming better stewards of God's many blessings.

Jer 31:7-9; PS 126:1-6; Heb 5:1-6; Mk 10:46-52

Our Psalm today, *"The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy,"* sheds light on our glorious Gospel reading about the healing of the blind man, Bartimaeus.



We can learn a lot from Bartimaeus when it comes to our own personal relationship with Jesus. Many of us struggle with something from which we need healing — physical blindness, illness, addiction, bad habits, anger, sin. In our weakness, do we confidently cry out to Jesus knowing that He will help us? Oftentimes, we begin to, but then a voice in our thoughts tells us to doubt and encourages us to stop trying, like the crowd in our Gospel. Although that voice is persistent and strong, we are called to cry out all the more. If Jesus can hear one voice in a crowd of many, then He can hear our direct prayer to Him in our hearts.

Our Gospel story closes with the miraculous moment when Bartimaeus is healed. The conversation with Jesus was simple. Jesus asked Bartimaeus what he would like Him to do. This man, blind for who knows how many years, desired sight. Jesus responded, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." He was healed and continued to follow Christ. There was not much that Bartimaeus had to do to become healed. All he needed was his undoubting faith.

Whatever it is that we are struggling with in this life, all Jesus asks of us is to have faith in Him. As a result, we will remain steadfast in our relationship with Christ and will have the strength to keep going. And although we might not be healed in this life, Jesus still hears our confident cries. And through our faith we will surely be healed in the next.

Thoughts to reflect on:

Jesus "has done great things for us" just as he did for Bartimaeus. These are gifts that he freely gives us, and they may include: our health, our success, the love of our family, and, of course, our faith. In return, we are called to consider using these gifts to help our neighbors in need by being good stewards and following the commandment Jesus gave us, "I give you a new commandment. Love one another as I have loved you." (Jn 13:34-35) A simple way to follow this commandment might be, "the gift that I have received, I will give as a gift."

A Well-Formed Conscience



The Church equips its members to address political and social questions by helping them to develop a well-formed conscience. Catholics have a serious and lifelong obligation to form their consciences in accord with human reason and the teaching of the Church. Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil.

Conscience always requires serious attempts to make sound moral judgments based on the truths of our faith. As stated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Conscience is a judgment of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed. In all he says and does, man is obliged to follow faithfully what he knows to be just and right" (no. 1778).

The formation of conscience includes several elements. First, there is a desire to embrace goodness and truth. For Catholics, this begins with a willingness and openness to seek the truth and what is right by studying Sacred Scripture and the teaching of the Church as contained in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. It is also important to examine the facts and background information about various choices.

Finally, prayerful reflection is essential to discern the will of God. Catholics must also understand that if they fail to form their consciences in the light of the truths of the faith and the moral teachings of the Church, they can make erroneous judgments.

FOOTNOTES

1) SCHOOL MINISTRY SUPPORT

Reduction in parish financial support in 2020 was due to improved cash position of School Ministry and parish debt. As of June 30, 2024, School Ministry savings is \$487,132. The parish does not have any debt. This year our parish was able to slightly increase financial support.

2) EMPLOYEE RETENTION CREDIT (ERC)

In the Fall of 2022, HTP received \$227,702 from the IRS. The ERC is a payment associated with the CARES federal program for keeping employees on payroll during the pandemic.

4) ENDING CASH BALANCE
