# "The Eucharist - the source and summit of our faith"

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ GN 14:18-20; PS 110:1-4;1 COR 11:23-26; LK 9:11B-17



Today we observe the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This beautiful feast celebrates the gift of the Eucharist, which the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches is the source and summit of our Christian faith. "For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself" (CCC, 1324).

The very word, Eucharist, means "thanksgiving" or "gratitude" and so this feast is especially meaningful to all of us who are striving to live as grateful stewards of all God's blessings to us. Surely the Eucharist is the greatest of all blessings because it is not only from God, it is really God — the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As St. Augustine wrote "We become what we receive."

Today's second reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians reminds us of the depths of love our Lord has shown us in the gift of the Eucharist, recalling Christ's words at the very first Eucharistic celebration. "The Lord Jesus... took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you." In that moment, and at every celebration of the Mass thereafter, Jesus gives us His very self in an act of complete humility and perfect love. How can we possibly show our gratitude for such a sublime gift? Jesus didn't ask if the disciples (or we) were worthy. He said, "This is my body which will be given up for you." (EP II, 102)

We receive the gift of the Eucharist with the greatest reverence and love. And, following our Lord's example, we can give ourselves generously to others in the week ahead.

## Some thoughts from Deacon Jim:

Did you know that St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians describing the Christ's words at the Last Supper were the earliest written account of Jesus' words from what was the first Eucharist? St. Paul's Letter was written about 50-52 A.D., and the first Gospel (attributed to Mark) wasn't written until about 70 A.D. The words that St. Paul captured are the same words we hear in the Eucharistic Prayer at every Mass. "This is my Body...Take and eat...This is my Blood ...take and drink..." As we receive Christ's Body and the Blood, we respond "Amen" – "Yes, I believe that this the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ." What an incredible gift we have been given.




# **ESTEVAN HENDERSON**
