Can I carry the crosses in my life?



Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

NM 21: 4B-9; PS 78: 1BC-2, 34-38; PHIL 2: 6-11; JN 3:13-17

One of the aspects of our Christian faith should be a desire to understand and appreciate the significance of many of the celebrations, feasts, and solemnities we as Catholics observe and experience. Today's Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by St. Helena; the construction and dedication of churches by Helena's son the Emperor Constantine on the site of Mt. Calvary where Christ was crucified; and the return of the Cross to Jerusalem by the Emperor Heraclius II.

As we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and its tradition, we need to recognize that this celebration goes much deeper than just some historical events. This celebration focuses on Christ's self-giving love when he gave his life for our sins by dying on the cross.

As Catholics, we're asked to remember the Cross every time we make the Sign of the Cross. We make that sign often and almost always at the beginning and the end of our prayers. However, that sign in and of itself is a prayer. Sometimes we do it automatically without really considering its meaning and importance. Rather than a hurried sign, we should make the Sign of the Cross with reverence, respect, and the constant reflection of how vital the Cross is to our salvation. Stewardship invites us to practice our faith with this deference and appreciation to the Lord, truly in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Some thoughts from Deacon Jim:

The cross was used by the Romans as a symbol of domination over the peoples they captured. It was a symbol of suffering and human cruelty at its worst. Jesus, by his death, transformed it to become a sign of love, forgiveness, and the very symbol of salvation and of God's boundless love for us. Carrying the crosses we have in our lives means staying true to God and our baptismal calling. Each of our lives and challenges is unique to us, and the cross we bear is ours alone.

Our cross may involve family difficulties, loss of our employment, serious illness, or death of a loved one. No two crosses are alike, and when we embrace our cross in faith, it can become the means through which God brings us freedom and new life, just as Jesus' death on the cross brought us freedom from the darkness of sin and a new life in him. When our crosses come, and they will, we may find ourselves asking "Why did God send me this cross?" This question and others can throw us into a crisis of faith but remember that God doesn't send us suffering and tragedy. He is a loving Father, who cries with us when we suffer just as he must have when he had to watch as his Son suffered and died on the cross. Recall, however, Jesus' death on the cross changed it from a symbol of cruelty into a sign of love, forgiveness, and of God's love. When we pray for strength to handle our crosses, look at Jesus on the crucifix, remember his suffering and death, but also remember by his rising from the dead he brought us new life and our salvation.


