



Questions for Faith Sharing Oct. 12 Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In next Sunday's Gospel, Luke 17:11-19, the leper is healed by Jesus but saved by his recognition of God's action. Our faith can't be inert; we can't passively accept the abundant gifts God has given us as simply our due. Instead, we should seek every opportunity to return to the source of our blessings, to give God thanks, yes, but also because with each act of recognition we affirm our faith and properly orient ourselves to the source of those blessings.

Is My Faith Bigger Than a "Mustard Seed"?



Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary TimeHAB 1:2-3; 2:2-2-4; PS 95:1-2, 6-9; 2 TM 1:6-8, 13-14; LK 17:5-10

Our readings today show us that living a stewardship way of life, that is, a life focused on serving God and His Kingdom, is not easy. They also show us that our lives belong to God, not to us, and that God will indeed bring about the fulfillment of His kingdom. We just need to have faith that He can do it and commit to do our small part in His grand design. This is both our privilege and responsibility as Christian stewards.


Jesus makes this privilege and responsibility clear in today's Gospel passage from Luke. When the apostles ask the Lord to increase their faith, He tells them that even faith the size of a mustard seed is all that is needed to move mountains (because it is God who does the heavy lifting). We need only take the tiniest step forward, and He will do the rest.

However, living our lives in His service is also very much our responsibility, as Jesus explains through the parable of the unprofitable servant later in this gospel. Our Lord describes a scene in which a servant has just come in from tending to the master's affairs and asks whether it would be reasonable for the master to begin waiting on his servant. Of course, it would not be reasonable! The servant would be expected to continue to serve his master until he has completed the work the master has given him that day. Jesus says we should have this same attitude before God.

My gifts of time, my talents, and the treasure entrusted to me all belong to God. They were given to me to be used in service to others. Our very lives belong to God, too. So, to make this very clear, whatever we do on God's behalf with our lives and our gifts is our God-given responsibility. The stewardship way of life makes the privilege and responsibility of serving God and His kingdom a reality.

Some thoughts from Deacon Jim:

The apostles asked Jesus to "increase our faith." Jesus used a parable to explain that faith the size of a mustard seed shows how our small, unremarkable offerings of compassion and generosity can accomplish great things. This parable in Luke's gospel isn't just about making a tree uproot itself but rather it challenges us to use the opportunities we have for planting and reaping the harvest of justice, compassion, and reconciliation in our homes, our parishes, and in our communities. Jesus also uses the mustard seed as a lesson about power – real power is not a matter of strength or force but of the resolve to use whatever resources and abilities we possess to affect meaningful change, to be more understanding of those who may be different from us, and to accomplish lasting good. Thus, our faith the size of a mustard seed is an unmistakable conviction that every small act of selfless kindness, act of forgiveness, or act of unseen compassion can and will transform our small part of the world into one of justice and peace. In our dysfunctional world today, we have to start somewhere to bring justice and peace.
