

Questions for Faith Sharing Oct. 5 Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

In next Sunday's Gospel, Luke 17:5-10, the disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith in response to Jesus' teaching that they must forgive a brother or sister who has sinned against them every single time, even if it's many. Jesus replies that they don't need more faith; even faith the size of the smallest of seeds is enough to literally move mountains. They already have what they need. Jesus goes on to tell them they are not masters to be served but servants who gratefully complete all the tasks their loving master gives them – including the task of forgiveness.

Do I step over a "Lazarus" by my life?

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time
AM 6:1A, 4-7; PS 146:7-10:1 TM 6:11-16; LK 16:19-31

We have all been given significant gifts by God in the form of Time, Talents, and Treasure. Today's readings remind us that these resources, these gifts, are meant to be used for great good. And that failure to do so has eternal consequences.

We see the urgency for us to put our gifts to good use in today's Gospel passage from Luke. Our Lord tells the rather chilling parable of the rich man who ignored poor Lazarus during their lifetimes. When the rich man dies, he goes down to the netherworld, while Lazarus is taken to the eternal joy and comfort in the bosom of Abraham. The rich man keenly regrets his indifference towards the needs of Lazarus, but it is too late for regret. His choices have played out, and now the rich man will face the consequences of his failure to use the gifts God gave him.

Pursuit of God's kingdom and care for the poor are not trifling matters. Our Lord makes this clear to us time and again in the Scriptures and the constant teachings of our 2,000-year-old Church. We are free to ignore these teachings and live instead for ourselves. But there will be tragic results for us in the end. And, because we are made for eternity, living selfishly on this earth does not really bring us true happiness anyway. Just look at the rich man in the parable!

So how can we use our gifts from God for great good? By embracing a stewardship way of life. By putting God first in all areas of our lives — in the ways we spend our time, the ways we share our talents, and the ways we use of our financial resources. Stewardship living calls us out of our comfort zone and into commitment to the Lord and the things that matter to Him.

Some thoughts from Deacon Jim:

I like this gospel because it is such a vivid example of how we can get caught up in our daily life and not notice the poor and those in need around us. At first, it may seem that the story of Lazarus belongs only in the time of Jesus' life, but there are many "Lazaruses" at our doors today whom we overlook, ignore, or dismiss. Today's gospel challenges us to remove the blinders of self-centeredness from our eyes and hearts to see God in our midst in the poor, the marginalized, the immigrant, and the forgotten in society. We are reminded of the dignity of every human being who is created in the image of God, and our responsibility to treat one another as brothers and sisters, sons and daughters of God. The story of Lazarus also confronts us with the question of how to deal with our resources. The rich man wasn't condemned for being rich but for failing to use his resources to alleviate the suffering of Lazarus who he stepped over each day. The question for us is how do we use our resources to help others?

HTCS Needs Workers

The HT Community Servants (HTCS) is a ministry that has been providing services to parishioners and others in the community since 2014 with a Spring and Fall workday each year. HTCS provides assistance to our parishioners and our neighbors in the community who need help with yard work, minor repairs in the yard, and to help them make their property fire safe. This includes senior citizens, single parents and those who are disabled.

The ministry is based on Jesus' commandment to love and serve God and our neighbor... "But someone may well say, "You have faith and I have works; show me your faith without the works, and I will show you my faith by my works". (James 2:18)
