
#### **New Baptismal Font**

Our original Baptismal Font had succumbed to dry rot because a hole in the copper cladding was allowing water to seep into the wooden structure beneath the copper. A design model for a new Font was presented to our Pastor and the Liturgy Committee and accepted. The design included a seven-sided pedestal and apron to hold the basin. Seven is considered a perfect number and is mentioned numerous times in Holy Scripture.

To continue the use of hammered copper within the furniture of the Eucharistic Chapel, Baptistry and Nave, a coppersmith from Missoula, Montana was commissioned to build the Font's top and basin. The wood used to construct the Font's pedestal and apron is African Mahogany. Carved into six sides of the apron are symbols of the Holy Spirit, including: the dove, wind, oil, fire, the hand, and water. On the seventh side is inscribed, "I have called you by name, you are mine" (Isaiah 43:1). The Font was designed, built and donated by a parishioner. It will be blessed by Fr. Vic on the Easter Vigil.

#### The Veiling of Crosses & Images What is the reason for the veiling of crosses and

#### images?

The veiling of crosses and images is a sort of "fasting" from sacred depictions which represent the paschal glory of our salvation. Just as the Lenten fast concludes with the Paschal feast, so too, our fasting from the cross culminates in an adoration of the holy wood on which the sacrifice of Calvary was offered for our sins. Likewise, a fasting from the glorious images of the mysteries of faith and the saints in glory, culminates on the Easter night with a renewed appreciation of the glorious victory won by Christ, risen from the tomb to win for us eternal life.

#### When may crosses and images be veiled?

Crosses and images may be veiled on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Crosses are unveiled following the Good Friday Liturgy, while images are unveiled before the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

#### Questions for Faith Sharing Apr. 20 Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

In next Sunday's Gospel, John 20:1-9, the empty tomb is a source of confusion and anxiety for Mary Magdalene, Peter and his beloved disciple. Mary and the beloved disciple do not even enter at first. Only Peter does, and what he finds there perplexes him utterly. As Peter reflects, he finds reason for hope. Anyone moving Jesus' body would have left it bound; it would have been much easier to transport fully wrapped. The discarded burial cloths signify that the one once bound by them was now free.

#### The Last Week of Lent-Is Almsgiving just for Lent?



#### Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion IS.50:4-7; PS 22: 8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24; PHIL 2:6-11; LK 22:14-23:56

This is Palm Sunday, the beginning of the week leading to Triduum and Easter. Today's Gospel tells the story of the Passion and death of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Two very different responses to our Lord's passion are highlighted during the Gospel reading from Luke today: the response of Simon of Cyrene and the response of Jesus' disciples and acquaintances. Of Simon we read, "They took hold of a certain Simon, a Cyrenian, who was coming in from the country; and after laying the cross on him, they made him carry it behind Jesus." Whether Simon entered willingly and compassionately into this service or whether he took up the Cross of Christ with a grudge, we don't know. What we do know is that Simon did his part faithfully. He stayed near to Christ, carrying the Cross until our Lord reached Golgotha, the site of His crucifixion. We also know from tradition that Simon's family was among the first of the early Christians. Staying near to Christ, embracing the Cross (quite literally), transformed his life.

In contrast, we read of another reaction to Jesus' passion and death, namely that "all His acquaintances stood at a distance." They knew Jesus! They had heard him preaching and teaching, some followed Him for three years, they witnessed His signs and miracles, maybe even benefited personally from them. Perhaps they did not participate in mocking Him or calling for His crucifixion, but they chose to stay a safe distance from Him when the going got tough. Unlike Simon, they refused to go too near to Christ.

And then we have Peter. His closest and most ardent follower – "Lord, I am prepared to die with you!" But, indeed, before the cock crowed, Peter had denied Jesus three times. Fortunately, unlike Judas Iscariot, Peter recognized his failure and sought the Risen Christ's forgiveness.

Where do you place yourself this week? Keeping your distance from all the pain and suffering Christ endured? Or close by, staying near to Him as Simon, the Cyrenian, did? It is when we go near to Christ that we can be transformed by Him. It is by embracing the crosses in our lives, dealing with them rather than trying to run from them, that we become His true disciples.

And it is when we are like Peter and recognize our failures and seek Jesus' love and mercy; when we acknowledge our sins and ask for his forgiveness that we repair the broken relationship that He wants with each of us. This is also when we live His commandment to "Love one another, just as I have loved you" – by helping those in need.

#### Deacon Jim's something to think about:

This is the last week of Lent. That doesn't mean that we should drop all the good things we have been doing or trying to do during Lent. Maintaining the good habits of prayer and the other two elements of Lent (fasting and almsgiving) should continue throughout the year. In previous weeks I've written about prayer and fasting, but not in much detail about almsgiving. So, I'm turning to Pope Francis for his description of almsgiving.

The Pope said that almsgiving is not just about the money; it is a gesture of love which directs us toward those we meet and a gesture of sincere attention to those who come to us for help. Almsgiving, "... must carry with it all the richness of mercy," the Pope said, and then concluded, "Just as mercy has a million paths, a million processes, so too is almsgiving expressed in many ways to alleviate the disadvantages of all those in need." We are given opportunities to be an "almsgiver" every day of the year. It isn't just a Lenten practice. This year allow your almsgiving practices to guide your actions as a Christian steward throughout the year.
