Where is God in my life?

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time AM 8:4-7; PS 113:1-2, 4-8;1 TM 2:1-8; LK 16:1-13 or LK 6:10-13



After today's readings, we can't say we have not been warned about the dangers of mixed-up priorities. God's Word is very clear on the necessity of putting Him first in all areas of our lives.

We hear this in the First Reading from Amos. The Lord has harsh words for those who would take advantage of the poor and whose priorities are not aligned with God's.

In the Second Reading from St. Paul's letter to Timothy, Paul gives us the antidote to the self-centeredness condemned in our First Reading. Paul's antidote is to imitate Christ, "who gave Himself as a ransom for all." Rather than thinking of Himself and how to "get ahead," Christ gave Himself away — completely — for our sake. Although we aren't expected to die on a cross, we are expected to live our lives by "giving ourselves" to help others.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, the Lord shows us how to bridge the gap between worldly thinking and priorities and eternal thinking and priorities. Jesus tells the parable of the corrupt but clever steward who is about to be fired after his master discovers the steward has been squandering his property. Realizing his imminent unemployed status, the clever steward reaches out to the various debtors of his master to wheel and deal with them, making friends who would look out for him when he became jobless.

What if we put that kind of effort into our own tasks as good stewards of all God's gifts to us? Not cheating, of course, but by devoting our full energies to our prayer life. By doing this, we could make more time for prayer as individuals, as couples, as families, and as a parish. And, what if we got as creative as the "bad steward", but in a positive way, in the use of our finances so that we could give more generously to the poor and the advancement of God's kingdom on the earth? These are our lessons and our challenges from today's readings.

Some thoughts from Deacon Jim:

If it seems that the message of life's priorities has been a theme for several weeks, it has been. Unfortunately, like with most things, we probably need to be reminded. I learned in leadership that if something was important, I needed to repeat it often. I think that's what prayer is - constantly communicating with God about what we need; and not forgetting to thank him too. Of course, he already knows what we need, but as humans we'll feel better if we keep our request "top of mind." So, my takeaway for us this week is "make God first in your life" not just with your resources, but with your prayer time, and with how we use our talents to serve those in need. By doing this, we will be satisfying St. Paul's teaching in the second reading -"This will be good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth." Think about what you can do this week.


