## Questions for Faith Sharing Nov. 9 The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

In next Sunday's Gospel, John 2:13-22, Jesus goes to the earthly temple in Jerusalem and drives out the money changers, accusing them of turning his Father's house into a marketplace. He claims he can rebuild the temple in three days. The evangelist reminds us that Jesus was talking about the "temple of his Body." If Jesus' risen body is the temple, the gathered people of God are the Body of Christ on earth, therefore, they are the temple, the place of God's holiness and life-giving power.

## Should We Pray for the Dead?

## All Souls' Day

WIS 3:1-9, PS 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6, ROM 5:5-11 Or ROM 6:3-9, MT 25:34, JN 6:37-40



On All Souls Day, the Church prays for all who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. The Scriptures remind us of the hope we share in Christ. The Book of Wisdom assures us that "the souls of the just are in the hand of God" (Wis 3:1), while St. Paul teaches that through Baptism, we were united with Christ in His death so that we might also live with Him forever (Romans 6:3-9).

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us words of profound comfort and promise: "Everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:40). Eternal life is God's greatest gift to us, and it shapes the way we live here and now.

As Christian stewards, we are called to make use of the time, talents, and treasure entrusted to us in ways that prepare us for eternity. Each day is an opportunity to serve God, love our neighbor, and hand on the gift of faith to others by our words and actions.

As we pray for the faithful departed today, may we also renew our own commitment to live as disciples who use well the gifts we have been given, so that one day we may share in the fullness of life with Christ, who has promised to raise us up on the last day.

## Some thoughts from Deacon Jim:

Today on All Souls Day we commemorate all those who have fallen asleep in Christ marked with the sign of faith and who, we pray, may one day join the saints around the great banquet table of the Lord. These are family members and friends, as well as those unknown to us. One of my favorite funeral readings is from the Book of Wisdom that reminds us, "You have mercy on us all...and you overlook people's sins that they may repent."

God loved us so much that he gave us his Son to become human, suffer and die, and then rise from the dead for our salvation. That's our belief. Today, we remember those who have gone before us. Some may have led exemplary lives; others led good, faith-filled lives, but haven't yet been joined with the saints in heaven; and some may have been estranged from us and may seem to have been estranged from God. But we shouldn't judge.

Recall the words in today's reading from Wisdom, "For you love all things and loathe nothing that you made." Thus, while we are still sinners, God loves us and Christ died for our salvation. What hope we have! We pray before receiving the Body of Christ "O Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, only say the word and I shall be healed." This is our prayer for us and for all the souls of those who have gone before us and who we commemorate today on The Feast of All the Faithful Departed, (Dia de Los Muertos). Pray for the dead every day, not just today!
